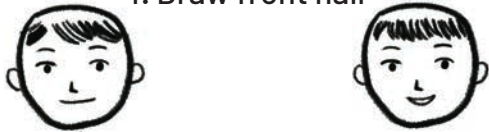

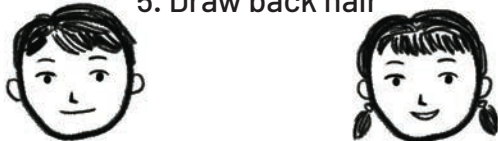

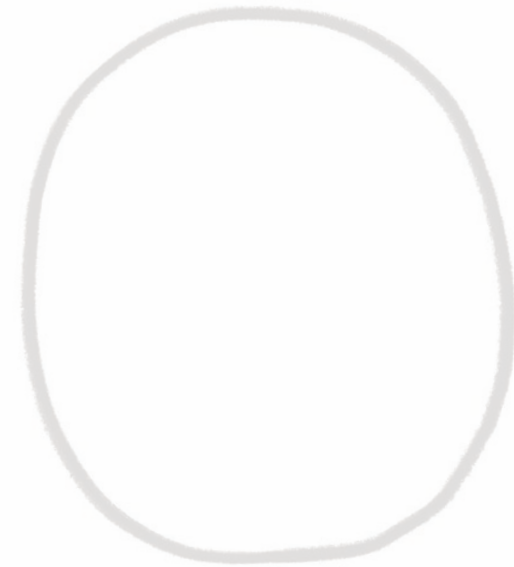

On the fifth day God said, "Let the water be filled with living things. And let birds fly in the air above the earth." So he did it!

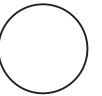
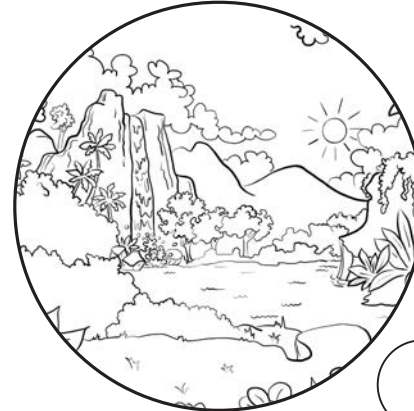
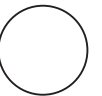
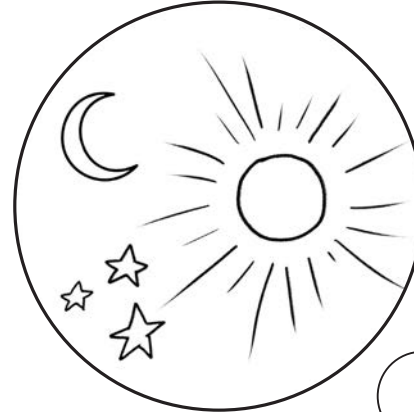
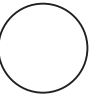
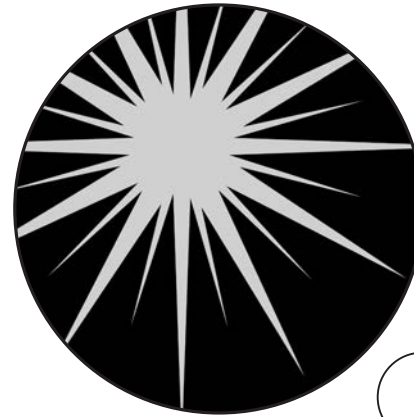
Then on the sixth day God made all the animals that creep, crawl, hop and gallop!

Luke 2:1-20

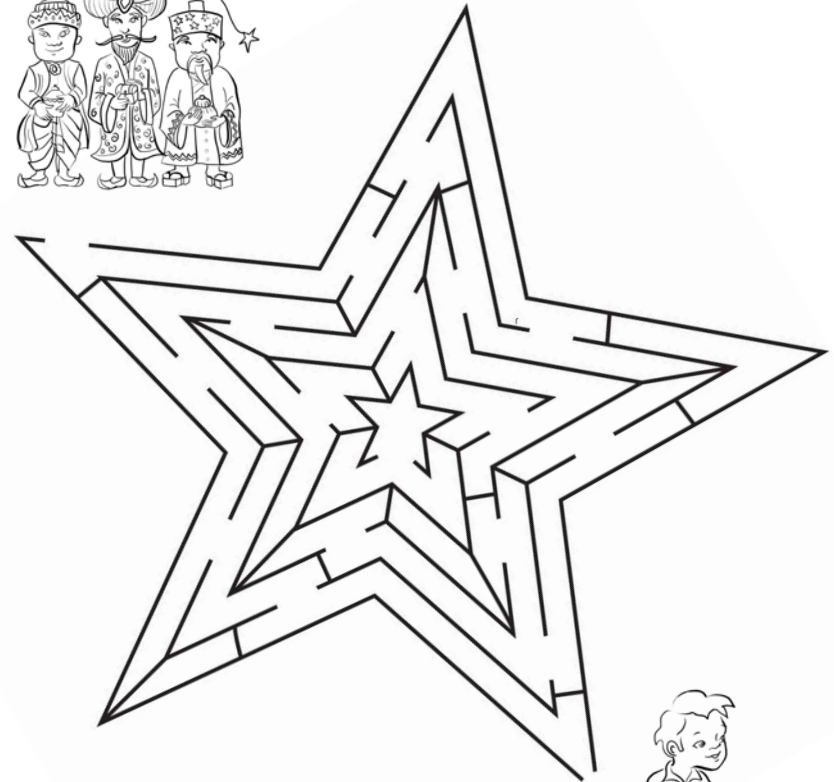

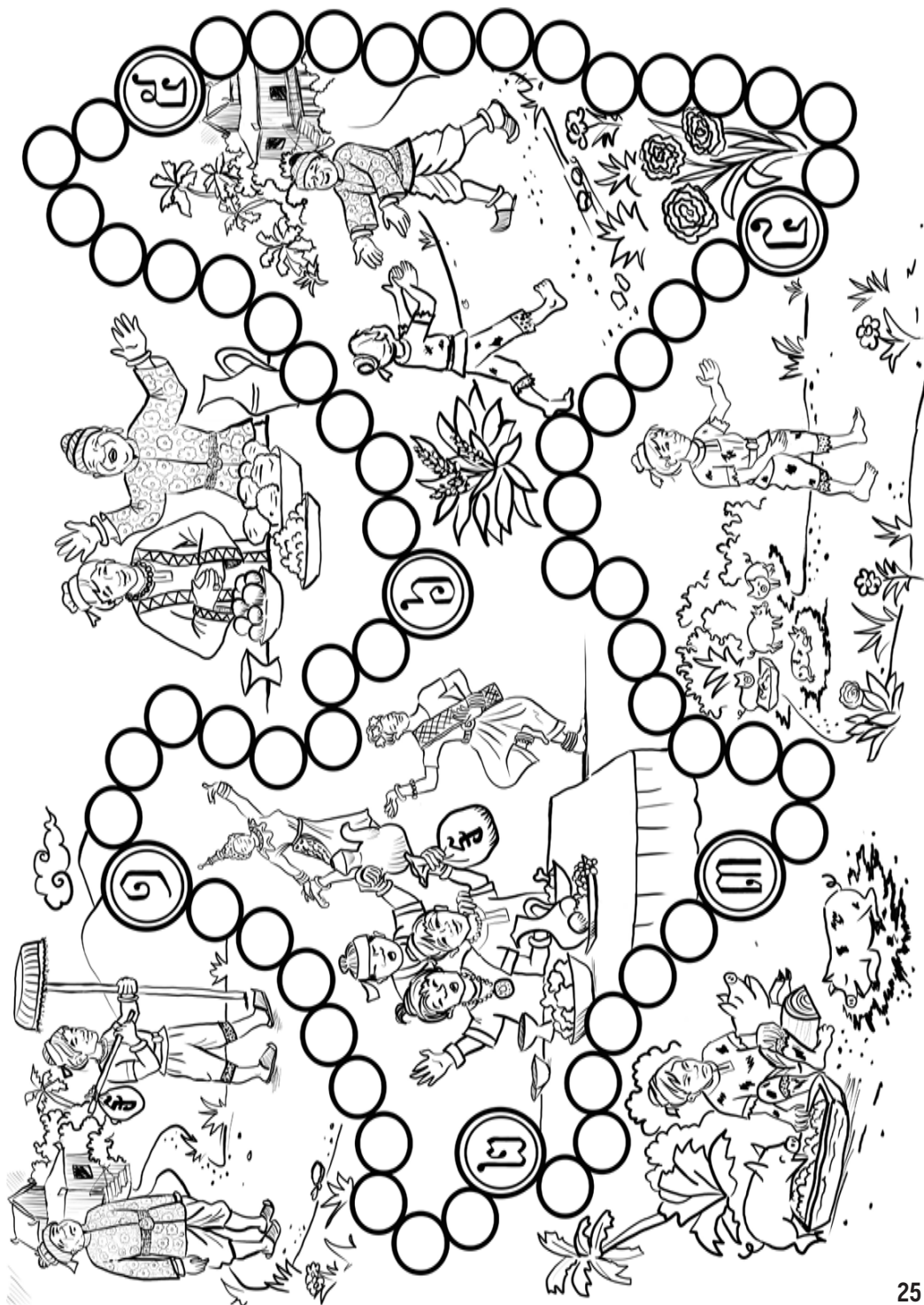
However, his father told his servant, "Quick! Bring out the best clothe for him and kill the fattened calf. We must celebrate!"
